
Aldeburgh Annual Town Council Report April 2015

Between 1st April 2014 and 1st March 2015 there have been a total of 112 crimes recorded for Aldeburgh. This has reduced from last year when the total offences recorded were 118. Out of the 112 crimes, 36 have been detected.____

Response times

Target: Attend 90% of Grade 1 incidents, within 15 minutes (of event creation time) in urban areas and 20 minutes in rural areas

For the Leiston & Beccles area (covers Aldeburgh) this is currently at 83.9%

Parking

The SNT have issued 210 fixed penalty tickets for parking over the year.

We have requested speed data for Saxmundham Road in relation to traffic travelling in both directions.

Speed monitoring over a one week period has found that 13.5% of vehicles travelling towards Aldeburgh on Saxmundham Road were driving at a speed that could result in a fixed penalty ticket or a driver speed awareness course offer.

During that same period it was found that 15.2% of vehicles travelling away from Aldeburgh on Saxmundham Road were driving at a speed that could result in a fixed penalty ticket or a driver speed awareness course offer.

Last year was yet again a busy year for events which included The Police Fun Day, The Carnival, The Mayor's Parade and Remembrance Sunday to name but a few.

The team have engaged in a number of priorities within the town including road safety, ASB in Crag Path over the summer months, dog fouling on Kings Field and also an increased no cold calling zone in Aldeburgh.

We have delivered internet safety presentations and awareness campaigns to all the schools. A large multi-agency information day was held at the Community Centre to help make residents aware of the services available to them.

A new Checked out initiative has been introduced to increase security awareness with in the High Street shops.

The team would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents of Aldeburgh and the Town Council for their support over the past year.
