3.1 Museum Update

Cllr Palmer asked Cllr Fox to give an update of progress made during the past month. She explained that the Museum Trustees had a positive meeting with the Heritage Lottery Fund representatives and from this meeting they have made the decision to employ a quantity surveyor to assist with the next stage of the grant application. She asked ATC to consider making a contribution to this cost, which Cllrs discussed at some length.
