

ALDEBURGH RNLI

At the lifeboat station in Aldeburgh, we currently have two boats on service:

- All-weather Mersey-class lifeboat, Freddie Cooper, which launches and is recovered from the beach. Freddie Cooper was delivered 30 years ago, and we celebrated with a demonstration launch in November.
- An inshore D-class, Susan Scott which launches and is recovered from the beach, or is transported to the River to launch and recover at Aldeburgh Yacht Club

Following an extensive coastal review and a local lifesaving effect review, when Freddie Cooper is retired, it was announced last July that she will be replaced by an Atlantic 85.

The Atlantic 85, was introduced to the RNLI in 2005 and is one of the fastest craft in the RNLI fleet.

the Atlantic 85 works equally well in shallower water or fairly challenging open sea conditions.

In the event of a capsize, it can be manually righted by an inflatable bag and the crew can quickly restart its inversion-proofed engines.

Length: 8.44m

Speed: 35 knots (approx 40 miles per hour)

Endurance: 3 hours max, until refuelling is necessary

Crew: 3-4

Weight: 1.8 tonnes Engine: 2 x 115hp

A training Atlantic 85 was delivered mid-March. As yet, we do not have a confirmed timescale for the Atlantic 85 to go into service. A new Atlantic 85 is being built for our station.



Intensive crew training is underway, as all crew need to transition their skills from the current qualifications on the Mersey and the D-class, onto the Atlantic 85.

We will retain the D-class inshore lifeboat when the Atlantic is on service. Freddie Cooper will be returned to the RNLI.

The Shop on Crag Path is open 10.30am – 4.30pm.
